



Church of Second Chances*

Eight weeks Joanna Patcha Mondays, Oct. 1 to Nov. 19 6:30 to 8:30 pm NLC 206 \$15



This is an eight-week course introducing participants to the Christian principle of restorative justice. Through Scripture, book study, prayer, videos and group discussion, we will explore common misconceptions about people in prison and how such misunderstandings have shaped our sense of responsibility. In addition, we will gain a deeper understanding of the experience of people behind bars, and how criminal justice experts and legislators are struggling to fix the public health and safety disasters resulting from mass incarceration in the United States. The course views incarceration through the lens of faith, hoping to inspire a prophetic revision that invites restoration, mercy, and reconciliation.

Pope Francis states, Therefore, the Church proposes a form of justice that is humanizing, genuinely reconciliatory, a justice that leads the wrongdoer, through an educative path of encouraged penance, to rehabilitation and total reinsertion in the community. How important and good it would be to take on this challenge, so as not to let it fall into oblivion.




Acts tells the story of the spread of the



Safe Environment Policy

All volunteers must attend a Protecting God's Children workshop. This two and a half hour program is intended to educate volunteers to recognize and prevent sexual abuse. Preregistration is required. You can sign up online at virtus.org. After completing the registration for a Virtus account, you will be asked to acknowledge receipt of other required notices and to choose a date to attend a workshop. You will then be prompted to enter the necessary information and sign off on a required background release form. After the workshop, you will be asked to keep your training updated through online monthly bulletins. The monthly training requires approximately fifteen (15) minutes. There is an additional yearly recertification. You will be notified by Virtus, through email, of the bulletins and the recertification. It is important that you select the appropriate diocesan location when you register. Please select St. Matthew Church.

St. Matthew will hold workshops on Sept. 22 and 29, Oct. 11, Nov. 14 and Dec. 11. Register at virtus.org.

The following Safe Environment forms may be found on our website at stmatthewcatholic.org.

- Release and Authorization Form authorizes the parish to request a background check. The form is submitted to the Diocese of Charlotte by the parish for processing.
- Volunteer Profile asks for standard personal information.
- Acknowledgement of Receipt Form, which is the last page of the Code of Ethics Policy of the Diocese of Charlotte; this should be signed and dated.
- Approved Driver Form is now required for any volunteer who drives a personal or parish vehicle on behalf of St. Matthew Catholic Church. Once approved as a driver, additional online training for defensive driving will be required.
