

Welcome to Faith Formation!

Our primary goals in all our programs is to provide families with an opportunity to encounter Christ through spiritual, social and service-based activities and lessons.

It is an honor and a privilege to serve and support your family!







Parent Involvement

As the primary catechists in a child's faith life, we feel the presence of parents is crucial to our programming. We offer a variety of volunteer roles with flexible time commitments (*see next page*).

If however, a parent is unable to commit to one of these volunteer roles, *every parent in our program is expected to be present at a minimum of* three *sessions* as support for the children, other volunteers and faith formation team.

Program Volunteer Opportunities

Preschool or Elementary

Sunday PS/KN Catechist – those who shepherd the children, facilitate lessons and crafts (*Commitment: weekly, minus holidays*)

Elementary Catechists – those who shepherd the youth, build relationships and facilitate lessons (*Commitment: 2x/month*)

Elementary Activity Leaders – those who facilitate craft, music, games or kinesthetic learning time; (*Commitment: 1-2x/month*)

Sacramental Catechists – those who guide the children through lessons to prepare for Reconciliation and First Communion. (*Commitment: 2x/month*)

RCIC Catechists – those who guide older

children (3rd-6th) through lessons to prepare for Reconciliation and First Eucharist. (*Commitment: weekly, minus holidays*)

Special Events

Family Connections/Special
Events – helping to plan, prepare
or facilitate monthly events
(Commitment: seasonally)
Family Discipleship – help
facilitate preset activity for
children and parents
(Commitment: 6x/year)

Special Needs

SPRED– one-on-one catechist for our special needs friends, facilitating lesson (*Commitment: 2x/month*)

BRIDGE – one-on-one mentor for child with special needs in mainstream program (Commitment: 2x/month)

Middle or High School

shepherd the youth, build relationships and facilitate lessons (*Commitment: 2x/month*)

Edge Small Group Leaders – those who facilitate group discussions, build relationships and mentor youth preparing for Confirmation (*Commitment: 2x/month*)

RCIT Catechists – those who guide teens through lessons to prepare for Confirmation or full initiation into the Catholic Church (*Commitment: weekly, minus holidays*)

Life Teen Core Member – those who facilitate group discussions, build relationships and mentor teens in walking as disciples of Christ (*Commitment: weekly, minus holidays*)

Responsibilities for all Volunteers: complete all safe environment requirements; be prepared and on time; continue formation in your own faith life; pray for and love the youth and families you serve

Behavior and Conduct Expectations

Show respect for yourself and others.

Always keep your hands and feet to yourself.

If it does not belong to you, do not touch it.

Nice words, good choices – always be kind.

Try your best.

Spend time in prayer every day.

Sacramental Preparation

If your child has not been baptized, please contact the Director of Religious Education to learn how to proceed.

Reconciliation and First Eucharist

CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Children who have completed first grade Faith Formation or Catholic school must register with the Faith Formation office in second grade in order to receive the sacraments in the parish. If there has not been a year of Faith Formation or Catholic school completed, parents must contact the Director of Religious Education to learn how to proceed.

PUBLIC or PRIVATE (non-Catholic) SCHOOL

Children begin their preparation by registering for "Year 1" in either first or second grade, followed by "Year 2" in second or third grade. It is during Year 2 that both sacraments will be received.

3rd Grade or Older

Children entering the program in third grade or older are eligible for our RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) or RCIT (Rite of Christian Initiation for Teens) program and should contact the Director of Religious Education to learn how to proceed.

Confirmation

CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Youth who have completed seventh grade Faith Formation or Catholic school must register with the Faith Formation office in eighth grade in order to receive the sacrament in the parish. If there has not been a year of Faith Formation or Catholic school completed, parents must contact the Director of Religious Education to learn how to proceed.

PUBLIC or PRIVATE (non-Catholic) SCHOOL

Youth begin their preparation by registering for **Edge** in seventh grade, followed by a second year in **Edge** in eighth grade. Reception of the sacrament occurs at the end of eighth grade.

9th Grade or Older

Children entering the program in high school are eligible for our RCIT (Rite of Christian Initiation for Teens) program and should contact the Director of Religious Education to learn how to proceed.

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
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

Policies & Expectations

Attendance

Regular attendance is expected. Up to three absences are permitted before makeup work is necessary for sacramental preparation years. If you are aware that your child will be missing a number of classes due to activities or family obligations please contact the Office of Faith Formation before the absences occur.

Please keep your child home if he/she has displayed any flu-like symptoms or fever within 24 hours of their session. We will make use of alcoholbased hand sanitizer, encourage handwashing, and supply sanitizing wipes in each classroom.

If your child is ill, and will miss several classes, please let the Faith Formation team know!

Early Dismissal*

To minimize disrupting your child's small faith community and to respect the time offered by the volunteer catechists, we ask that students **not** be picked up early unless there is an **illness or emergency or a school obligation**.

If you are picking up early due to a conflict with sports or activities, we respectfully ask that you balance taking your child out of their Faith Formation session early with allowing them to arrive late for the activity on occasion.

If you pick your child up early more than twice, you will be asked to choose a different session time.

Cell Phones/Electronics

During sessions, teens and children are expected to be fully present and involved in the activity or discussion that is taking place. It is not necessary for them to have their cell phones. We prefer that they not be brought as they serve as a tempting distraction and youth do not always respect the 'silenced, out-of-sight and not used' expectation. If phones are brought and a youth is seen using it during session time, the phone will be confiscated and held until the end of session. Session time begins at the moment we open in prayer and ends when they are safely back in your care.

The Office of Faith Formation is not responsible for lost or damaged cell phones.
