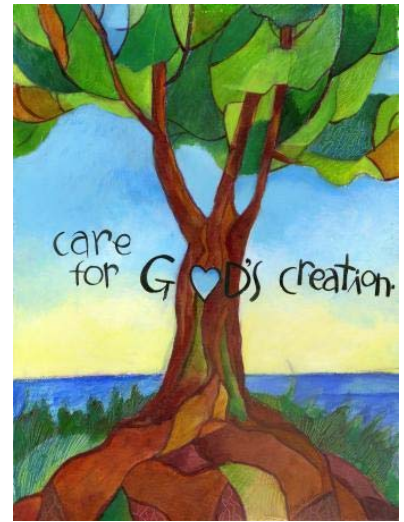


# Catholic Social Teaching: Care for God's Creation

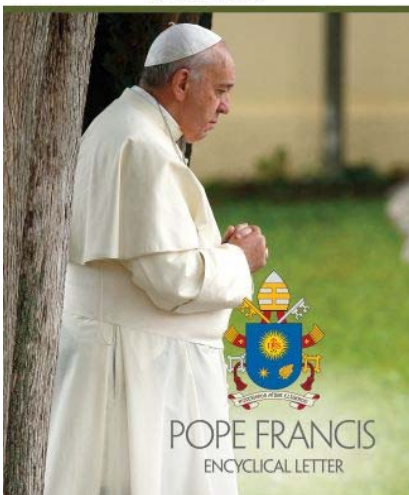

Pope Francis in *Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home* calls on every person to care for the earth and recognize how the environment impacts the most vulnerable. Respect for life means respecting all of God's creation. "A true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor ... Everything is connected. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society." (*Laudato Si'*, nos. 49, 91)
