



- We are grateful that many of you have been able to support the parish financially during this difficult time. While offertory gifts for the last six months of 2020 were 19% lower than the prior year, January 2021 offertory was only 12% lower than the prior year.
- Rigorous cost controls implemented by the parish yielded a \$435,000 reduction in operating expenses for the past six months, despite an additional \$30,000 of pandemic related cleaning expense. The net reduction in expenses largely offset the amount of reduced offertory.





## Diocesan Support Appeal ("DSA") and Priests' Retirement Assessment

- Due to the pandemic, the parish missed its 2020 goal by \$61,000 or 7%. However, the Diocese has made a concession to those parishes with reduced offertory levels and we will not be charged for this shortfall. The 2021 DSA campaign is underway. St. Matthew has an achievable goal of \$795,000, just slightly more than funds raised in 2020. Please consider making a pledge to the 2021 campaign and if possible increasing your gift to cover those unable to give this year. - Additionally, for over ten years, we have not met our Priests' Retirement assessment from the Diocese. Despite a lower goal, the parish missed its 2020 goal by \$47,000.

# Getting Through the Pandemic to our Exciting Future

- The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly reduced offertory giving for the first six months of our fiscal year. Expenses continue to be evaluated and reduced where possible. Outreach continues with our Monsignor McSweeney World Hunger Drive, lunch-to-go partnership with Roof Above, food collections to assist Catholic Charities and assistance to the homeless through mattress donations and apartment relocation. St. Matthew had a strong financial position entering the pandemic and as noted above, continues to receive solid offertory support from parishioners. As a result, St. Matthew did not apply for or receive any financial assistance or loans from the government to support parish operations.
