

Father Seraphim Michalenko, the foremost authority on the message and devotion of Divine Mercy, died on February 11, 2021 at age 90.

Father Seraphim spoke at St.

Matthew Catholic Church's 8th

Divine Mercy Day of Healing on the

Spirituality of St. Faustina, for

whom he served as vice postulator
for canonization.

When he was here you felt as if you were in God's presence, a byproduct of his humility, said Deacon Gary Schrieber, Leader and Spiritual Director of St. Matthew's Divine Mercy Ministry, who also spoke at the conference.

To me, Father Seraphim exemplified Faustina's Diary entry on "the soul filled with mercy cannot

help but radiate it to others," said Lorraine Carpenter, Divine Mercy Cenacles Lay Director at St. Matthew.

Father Michalenko smuggled photographic images of St. Faustina's Diary out of communist-occupied Poland and was involved in its translation to English.

His death on the Feast of Our
Lady of Lourdes at which she
declared "I am the Immaculate
Conception," to Bernadette Soubirous in 1858 was not a coincidence.
She is the Patroness of The Marians of The Immaculate Conception.

90th Anniversary of Jesus Appearing to St Faustina



The following article appeared in the February 26th edition of the Catholic News Herald, on page 21.

"Pope Marks 90th Anniversary of Divine Mercy Apparition

Vatican City - Marking the 90th anniversary of the apparition of Jesus to St Faustina Kowalska, Pope Francis wrote a letter to Catholics in Poland expressing his hope that Christ's message of divine mercy would remain "alive in the hearts of the faithful."

According to a statement released by the Polish bishops' conference February 22, the anniversary of the apparition, the pope said he was united in prayer with those commemorating the anniversary at the Divine Mercy Shrine in Krakow and encouraged them ask Jesus "for the gift of mercy. Let us have the courage to come back to Jesus to meet his love and mercy in the sacraments" he said. "Let us feel His closeness and tenderness and then we will also be more capable of mercy, patience, forgiveness and love."

In her diary, St Faustina wrote that she had witnessed a vision of Jesus on February 22, 1931, while she was living at a convent in Plock, Poland. Christ she wrote, had one hand raised in benediction and the other resting on his breast, from which emanated two rays of light. She said Christ demanded to have this image painted - along with the words "Jesus, I Trust in You" - and venerated."

The full description of this event can be found in St Faustina's diary, entry No. 47-48.



From the Diary of St. Faustina

Jesus: 'My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for my kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone. I am always supporting you, so lean on Me as you struggle, fearing nothing. Take the vessel of trust and draw from the fountain of life — for yourself, but also for other souls, especially such as are distrustful of My goodness.'"

I look forward with joy to the last stroke the Divine Artist will trace on my soul, which will give my soul a unique beauty that will distinguish me from the beauty of other souls. O great day, on which divine love will be confirmed in me. On that day, for the first time, I shall sing before heaven and earth the song of the Lord's fathomless mercy. This is my work and the mission which the Lord has destined for me from the beginning of the world. That the song of my soul may be pleasing to the Holy Trinity, do You, O Spirit of God, direct and form my soul yourself. I arm myself with patience and await Your coming, O merciful God, and as to the terrible pains and fear of death, at this moment more than at any other time, I trust in the abyss of Your mercy and am reminding You, O merciful Jesus, sweet Savior, of all the promises You have made to me. '
