First Communion Preparation: The Good Shepherd

(Week of Apr. 18)

"I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me" JN 10:11-18

During the Easter season, we continue to celebrate the Risen Christ, and His presence with us and within us that gives us His peace and allows us to know Him through the Eucharist.

Gather: *Beginning and Ending.* Start with the category of 'animals' – the first person names any animal (ex. horse). The other person must think of an animal that starts with the last letter of the animal that the first person names named (ex. elephant). Continue play (ex. tiger...rhino...ostrich...) Play alternates until someone cannot think of an animal!

Connect: As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be. Our game could go on and on, but eventually we would run out of words. That is true of most earthly things – eventually the fun runs out, or the batteries run out, or time runs out. The only thing that is forever is God, and because of Jesus' sacrifice, we have forever with Him! During the Easter season, we continue to celebrate all that Jesus has given us – most importantly the gift of Himself in the Eucharist. Today we will look at the other gifts Jesus gave us like inviting us to be one of his followers.
